The regular Harvey City Council meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. by Mayor Christopher J. Clark.

LEVY ORDINANCE #3390

**AN ORDINANCE LEVYING TAXES IN THE
CITY OF HARVEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR
BEGINNING MAY 1, 2019 AND ENDING APRIL 30, 2020**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Harvey, Cook County, Illinois:

ARTICLE 1

That the amount of taxes for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2019 and ending April 30, 2020 for all corporate purposes, to be levied upon all property subject to taxation with the City of Harvey, including railroads as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes for said year be and the same is hereby fixed at SEVENTEEN MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED THIRTY THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$17,433,000) and said sum is hereby accordingly levied upon all property in said City subject to taxation aforesaid.

That the said sum SEVENTEEN MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED THIRTY THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$17,433,000) being taxes to be levied for the fiscal year of this ordinance shall, when received, be used for the purpose of paying the following items for each of which an appropriation has been made in and by an Appropriation Ordinance passed by the Council of the City of Harvey; that the specific items as they appear in the Appropriation Ordinance are itemized hereinafter in the column headed "Appropriation" and the specific items and the amounts herein and hereby are listed in the column headed "From Tax Levy."

ARTICLE II

Additionally, there is hereby levied on all of the property subject to taxation within the City of Harvey, such sum is represented by 5% for bonds and 4.99% of all other extendable levy items, which sum is hereby authorized to be extended additionally for Loss and Cost.

ARTICLE III

The Mayor is empowered and directed to execute and to cause to be filed with the County Clerk of Compliance with the Truth in Taxation Act, the term requirements and conditions of which have been met at and before the adoption of this ordinance.

ARTICLE IV

The City Clerk of the City of Harvey be and is directed to forthwith file a certified copy of this ordinance with the Clerk of Cook County for the purpose of having extended the taxes levied under the terms hereof and to enable the proper authorities to collect the same when extended.

ARTICLE V

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days from and after its passage and approval as required by law. Publication in pamphlet form is authorized.

MONDAY – OCTOBER 14, 2019 – 7:00 P.M.**

The regular meeting of the Harvey City Council was called to order at 7:25 p.m. by Mayor Christopher J. Clark.

ROLL CALL:

Mayor Clark asked Deputy Clerk Anderson to call the roll of Council members. Present were Alderwoman Shirley Drewenski, Aldermen Marshun Tolbert, Quinton Crudup, Tracy Key, Randle-El, Tyrone Rogers and Mayor Christopher Clark.

Mayor Clark gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Point of Order

Alderman Key called for a point of order. I would like to amend the agenda and add two items for discussion: # 1 –To extend time for the seasonal workers in the Street Department and # 2- To purchase two additional trucks for the Street Department.

Mayor Clark said those items will be 5a and 5b under New Business, upon approval. We have a motion and a second.

Alderman Key made motion to the motion to amend the agenda. The motion was seconded by second by Alderman Randle El.

Voting Aye were Aldermen Rogers, Randle –El, Key, Crudup, Tolbert and Alderwoman Drewenski.

MOTION CARRIED

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Mayor Clark announced that public comments will be limited to 30 minutes, 3 minutes each:

#1 – GiGi Gayle: Business partner 20 years with Club O and Sky 11. We are here to talk about the liquor license Ordinance that closes at midnight. We are here because we want you to see the faces of those children, spouses, workers that would be effected by losing their jobs, and their lively hood.

#2 – Nikoue Palmatier a bartender for over 25 years. She praised the club owners for being so supportive of their workers. Without her job it would be an impact on her resources.

#3 -Victor Woods: An Attorney for Club O. All the these people here tonight represent jobs. No way can we take the jobs away from all these people a month before Christmas.

#4 –Cynthia Whitemon; Pleaded with the Mayor that she has already invested money into her mother’s 92nd Birthday party a Sugars babyyyys before this Ordinance took effect.. Please reconsider what difference is 2 hours going to do?

#5 – Asa Powell: Mayor we would appreciate if you would just talked to the businesses. We only want to operate for 5 hours, we just want our late hours on the weekends. All these peoples will be effected. We just want you to hear our side, we just want to come to a common ground.

#6 – Janet Rogers: I do understand that we need the tax dollars. Mayor, I would like you to reconsider. Where are those tax dollars coming from? I came to ask about the Community Center being open back into business so our kids can have to a place to go.

#7 – Terrence Milan owner of Club O, I’ve raised over \$22,000 dollars and paid for the funeral for the young man that got killed. I have bought a 1,000 bikes for kids for Christmas and a 1,000 book bags to help support the kids. I will personally write you a check for \$50,000 to donate to after school programs for these kids.

8- Marvin O’Neal; a single father, he works for Sky 11 and Club O these business help supply for families. I pray that you make the right decision.

9 - Kevin Moore I am a tax payer and we will be effected by the earlier closings. What are we going to do? The liquor is no the problem, the clubs are not the problem. We are going to show up. You need to talk to us. If you shut us down what are we going to do?

#10- Diamond Colbert a bartender at Club O, I have put myself through college, closing the club down at 12 o’clock is not the problem.

AMEND THE AGENDA

Alderman Rodgers motioned to amend the agenda to discuss the reversal of the 12:00 hour of Liquor sales. The motion was second by Alderman Rogers.

Mayor Clark “There is a Public Safety Committee meeting on tomorrow at 5:00 p.m. and on that agenda is this Ordinance #3376. (Hours of operation).

Alderwoman Drewenski “I don’t understand the tax dollars for the cover charge.”
Can the Comptroller present ”

Voting aye were Aldermen Rogers, Key, Crudup, Alderwoman Drewenski and Tolbert.

MOTION CARRIED

NEW BUSINESS:

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:

Moved by Alderman Rogers to approve the Minutes dated September 9, 2019. The motion was second by Alderwoman Drewenski.

Voting Aye were Alderwoman Drewenski, Aldermen Crudup, Randle –El, Rogers, and Key.

Voting Nay was Alderman Tolbert.

MOTION CARRIED

Moved by Alderwoman Drewenski made the motion to accept the minutes dated September 16, 2019. The motion was second by Alderman Rogers.

Alderman Tolbert in those particular minutes it sounded like only one person spoke for that entire meeting.

Mayor Clark asked if there was something you would like added to the minutes?

Alderman Tolbert the minutes don't reflect some of the key issues, like the conversations that took place.

Alderman Randle- El for example; how items get placed on the agenda and who did we ask that to and what was their response. They need to be a complete thought, more detailed. If someone is reading the minutes they don't know what went on at that meeting.

Alderwoman Drewenski and Alderman Rogers withdrew their first motion.

MOTION WITHDRAWN

Moved by Alderman Drewenski made the motion to table the minutes dated September 16, 2019 for more details (complete the thought). The motion was second by Alderman Randle – El.

Voting Aye were Aldermen Key, Randle-El, Rogers, Crudup, Alderwoman Drewenski and Tolbert.

APPROVAL OF THE BILLS FOR PAYMENT:

Alderman Tolbert made the motion to table the Bills list and send to the Finance Committee. The motion was second by Alderman Rogers.

Voting aye were Alderman Key, Randel-El, Rogers, Crudup, Alderwoman Drewenski and Alderman Tolbert.

Alderwoman Drewenski: Point of Order I have a question? Is there any way we can we have a Committee meeting prior to the regular City council meetings?

Alderman Randle - El: There was on bills list missing for the meeting in September that got cancelled. I don't want to not pay bills.

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS FOR THE CITY OF HARVEY:

Ordinance #3385 - An Ordinance for the amendment to the current existing Cal Sag Enterprise Zone subject to the enterprise zone act of the State of Illinois.

Alderwoman Drewenski made the motion that Council approve Ordinance # 3385. The motion was second by Alderman Crudup.

Alderman Tolbert asked the Mayor to explain to the public what this Ordinance is.

Administrator Williams explained to the public that the Ordinance simply adds three other communities and expanding the Enterprise Zone that were not included the enterprise zone.

Voting Aye were Aldermen Crudup, Rogers, Key, Randle-El, and Alderwoman Drewenski and Tolbert.

MOTION CARRIED

Resolution #2902 - A resolution of the City of Harvey ,Cook County, Illinois authorizing a special event " Hands Across Harvey" for the City of Harvey.

Mayor Clark explained that this event is for us to come together in unity and create a human chain from 159th Wood to 159th & Lowe on Saturday –October 26, 2019 starting at 10 - 2 p.m. there will be a rally, food and entertainment afterward.

Alderman Randel -El made the motion that Council adopt Resolution # 2902. The motion was second by Alderman Rogers.

Voting Aye were Aldermen Rogers, Key, Crudup, Randle-El, Drewenski and Tolbert.

MOTION CARRIED

Resolution #2903 - A resolution establishing an intergovernmental agreement between Cook County on behalf of the Cook County Sheriff and the City of Harvey Cook County, Illinois.

Mayor Clark explained to the public that this Resolution deals with the 911 dispatch services from our Police Department the City of Harvey.

Mr. Bennett from the Cook County Sheriff Communications office gave a power point presentation talking about the Smart 911 system and how it would benefit the City of Harvey. It will shave minutes off of the 911 call and pinpoints the person's location.

Alderman Tolbert made the motion that Council adopt resolution # 2903. The motion was second by Alderman Randle –El.

Alderwoman Drewenski; Are the 911 operates bi-lingual?

Mr. Bennett: Yes, they speak about 5 different languages.

Alderman Randle- El “I would like more time to read over this. We get our packets on Friday and that not enough time to go through all these items.”

Alderman Tolbert we need time I just got this. It should go to committee. It sounds like candy to the residents.

Alderwoman Drewenski “My question, is if we delay this, that means we can't vote on it until another two weeks. What impact it will have on us, we know what our current situation is it's very detrimental to our City.

Alderman Rogers asked Chief Winter will the present personnel be replaced or used within the department?

Voting Aye were Aldermen Crudup, Rogers, Tolbert, Key, Randle-El, and Alderwoman Drewenski.

Resolution # 2905 - A resolution entering an agreement with Kane McKenna and Associates Inc. for Economic Development Services.

Mayor Clark and Mr. McKenna gave a brief power point presentation.

Alderman Tolbert made the motion that Council adopt Resolution # 2905. The motion was second by Alderman Randle –El.
